- 4. Enter the church's PIN and password.
- 5. If the password that worked for the SASR does not work for the CAQ, try reentering the password an "!" at the end. *Many passwords end with an "!"*.
- 6. If you do not have access to a computer, send the paper copy of the completed CAQ 2105 to your presbytery office or Stated Clerk.
